

INSURANCE INFORMATION FOR SLEEP STUDIES

Our sleep center staff will verify your medical insurance as a courtesy to you. However, since your insurance is actually a contract between you, your employer, and your insurance company, it is your responsibility to know your individual insurance coverage as quotes of coverage may change.

DEDUCTIBLE INFORMATION

It is Providence Hospital's expectation that unmet insurance deductibles will be collected on the night of the sleep study. We will notify you prior to your scheduled sleep study if you do have a deductible.

In the event that it is cost-prohibitive for you to pay the full amount of your deductible on the night of your sleep study, you will be billed for any outstanding balance and you will have the opportunity to make payment arrangements by calling the telephone number listed on that bill.

CO-INSURANCE INFORMATION

Percentage co-insurance charges will be billed to you after the sleep study has been performed. If your insurance does require you to pay a co-insurance, we will do our best to give you an estimate of those charges.

PROCEDURE CODES

If you would like to contact your insurance company directly to inquire about your sleep study benefits, it will be helpful for you to have the following sleep study procedure codes: **(Please note that sleep studies are considered an outpatient procedure.)**

- 95810 Polysomnogram (initial diagnostic sleep study)
- 95811 CPAP (therapeutic sleep study)
- 95805 MSLT/MWT (nap study)

It is important that you notify us if your insurance changes between the time you were scheduled and the date of your sleep study. If you fail to do so, you will be responsible for the cost of the entire sleep study.
